
Second Sunday after Christmas St. Andrew's Church January 4, 2026


Opening Sentences

A Reading from the Book of Jeremiah

Jeremiah 31:7-14

Please be seated.

Thus says the LORD:

Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob,

and raise shouts for the chief of the nations;

proclaim, give praise, and say,

"Save, O LORD, your people,

the remnant of Israel."

See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north,

and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth,

among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor, together;

a great company, they shall return here.

With weeping they shall come,

and with consolations I will lead them back,

I will let them walk by brooks of water,

in a straight path in which they shall not stumble;

for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn.

Hear the word of the LORD, O nations,

and declare it in the coastlands far away;

say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock."

For the LORD has ransomed Jacob,

and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him.

A Reading from the letter to the Ephesians

Ephesians 1:3-6,15-19a

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe.

The Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

Please stand.

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of Our Savior Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

All: Glory to you, O Christ.

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

`And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Celebrant: The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, O Christ.





born into poverty and exile, to proclaim the good news to the poor, and

freedom to all who are oppressed.

Celebrant: Blessed is your son, Jesus, who emptied himself of power and became foolishness

for our sake: heaven's child laid in a manger; God's anointed laid in a tomb. Born again from the shuddering earth, he is embodied forever in his living creation and

in these, its fruits of bread and wine.

All: Therefore, here in this place, we celebrate the life that was born at

Bethlehem, the life that Jesus has shared among his community through the

centuries, And shares with us now.

Celebrant: Blessed is our brother Jesus, bone of our bone and flesh of our flesh; who, on the

night when he was delivered over to death, took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is for you." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, whenever you drink it, to remember me." So, as we eat this bread and drink this

cup, we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Celebrant: Come now, O Spirit of Christ, brood over these bodily things, this bread and this

wine. May they be for us your body and blood, vibrant with life, healing,

renewing, and making us whole. Embrace us with your life-giving power, that as

bread and wine are made one with us, we may become one with you.

All: Blessed be God, forever. Amen.
