VESTRY CORNER - ST. ANDREW'S REOPENING PLAN UPDATE

The vestry discussed our reopening at their meeting on Thursday. The consensus of the vestry was that outside Zoom Eucharist was too fraught with difficult details for us to try at this point. Instead, we are going to try a simpler option sometime in late September – an 8:00 a.m. in-person Eucharist in the church, without Zoom and without music, followed by a 9:30 a.m. Zoom- only Morning Prayer service, with music. Details to follow.
