A PRIEST'S PONDERINGS...

The Rev. Allison Moore

Another of my favorite poems, from e.e. cummings, about resurrection:

i thank You God for most this amazing
day: for the leaping greenly spirits of trees
and a blue true dream of sky; and for everything
which is natural which is infinite which is yes

(i who have died am alive again today,
and this is the sun's birthday; this is the birth
day of life and of love and wings: and of the gay
great happening illimitably earth)

how should tasting touching hearing seeing
breathing any—lifted from the no
of all nothing—human merely being
doubt unimaginable You?

(now the ears of my ears awake and
now the eyes of my eyes are opened)

Yet this poem can seem almost flip—it's easy to be joyful when all is well (although we still forget to say "thanks" sometimes!). As I was hunting for a poem both about resurrection and Mother's Day (a major feast of Hallmark and of love if not of the church!) I found a [quotation by Julian of Norwich](#) from *Showings* that seems to me to set cummings' poem in context. [Showings](#) is an intimate account of visions of Jesus that Julian experienced when she was on the brink of death. She was meditating on blood flowing from the crown of thorns and an image of Jesus in agony, when,

"And just in that same time that it seemed to me, by all appearances, that his life might no longer last, and the showing of the end must needs be near—suddenly, as I beheld the same cross, his face changed into a joyful expression. The changing of his blissful expression changed mine, and I was as glad and merry as it was possible to be. Then our Lord brought this merrily to mind: "Where is now any point of thy pain or of thy grief?" And I was completely merry."

Resurrection is the capacity to know death, sorrow, and evil and still to trust that Jesus' love, God's resurrection power, can transform the worst of what we can know and do.

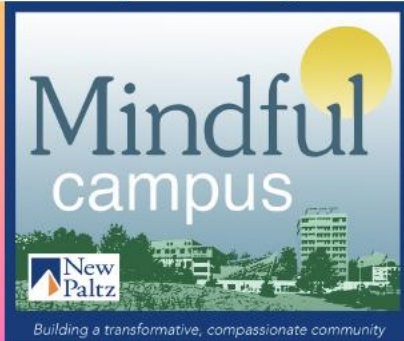
